Don began an apprenticeship as an electrician. He was blessed with two daughters, Shari and Kelly, whom he raised on his own. Work brought Don to the Twin Cities where he worked as an electrician for several different companies.

On June 14, 1969 Don was united in marriage to Karen Bergquist in Detroit Lakes, MN. They were blessed with a son, Brian. Don and Karen made their home in Brooklyn Center, MN.

Don's dream in life was to live on a Minnesota lake. Following his retirement in 1995 Don and Karen found the dream on Lake Geneva in Alexandria. They moved to Lake Geneva in 2000.


Don enjoyed trap shooting and hunting trips to Wyoming. You couldn't take the Navy out of Don; he loved to take his boat onto the chain of lakes for a day of boating. Don also loved tinkering and fixing things; he always had some project going out in the garage.

He knew that humor was good for the soul and just plain fun; he always had a joke or story to make you laugh.
